

Beiseker, Alta.
June 27, 1930.

A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in Mr. Loubet's office on June 27th and notice of meeting is hereby waived. All members of the Council were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The Secretary was requested to write the Department for information regarding the taxes on the nuisance ground and the possibility of having this property included in the boundaries of the Village.

Mr. Wisgerber was to hire some suitable person to clean stink-weeds from 1st Avenue as per weed inspector's instructions.

The matter of silent policeman, for either end of Block 1, 6th Street, was discussed and was to be referred to the Board of Trade at their next meeting.

The Village Police was asked to inspect, regularly, the park grounds as to sanitation and report same to Council.

A delegation consisting of Mr. Wisgerber was asked to notify Mr. Breifid that his cess pool should be cleaned at once and the contents of same hauled to the nuisance ground and under no condition to be put on the street or in the ditches, as it has been reported, as he has been doing.

The letter of Dr. Liesmer requesting payment for Scheffelmaier's account came up for discussion and Mr. Scheffelmaier was requested to attend this meeting and did attend and advised the Council that this account had been settled, that he had paid part cash and given a note

for the balance and that the note was at the Royal Bank for collection and that he would be making a payment on it soon, therefore the Mayor was authorized to write Dr. Fiesinger accordingly and to advise him that in the opinion of this Council he did not have a preferred claim against this Village.

Information regarding indigents was requested for next meeting when same can be more fully discussed.

The subject on 2nd Avenue, at Bank corner was recommended and approved and payment of same was also approved.

The subject on the north end of first Avenue was tabled until road problem is settled.

The matter of Railway crossing on O.N.R. was taken up with the engineers and they informed that according to railway rules that three crossings will not be allowed in a mile. This also was tabled until highway is built.

Report on hitching post on C.P.R. right-of-way was reviewed and Mr. Wedgwood was delegated to get cost of removing and repairing same and report at next meeting.

Wm. Wacker was authorized to destroy stray dogs within the Village and have stray removed same.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
