

Beiseker, Alberta.  
April 27<sup>th</sup> 1933.

A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in Mr. Rowan's office on April 27, 1933, and notice of meeting is hereby waived.

All members of the Council were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The representative of the Crown Lumber Company asked for a building permit for a Hardware store 30' x 24' with 10' stud of lumber structure.

This was contrary to By-Law No. 23 and could not be allowed as the By-Law now stands.

The Lumber Company naturally wanted to build with lumber when they were in that business and refused to build unless they could build with lumber. They were building a chain of Hardware stores and other Villages, all of whose By-Laws conflicted the same as ours, in every case they had altered the By-Law rather than loose the business.

This Council believes that a good Hardware store would be quite an addition to the Village and after hours of deliberation it was moved by Peter Schmaltz that By-Law No. 23 be amended to read as follows  
Excepting thereout and therefrom Lots One (1) to Eleven (11), Block 1, Plan 4011X and Lots Three (3) to Eleven (11), Block 2, Plan 4011X, Beiseker and these lots are subject to a frame building, providing same is built at a distance of a clear space of 66 feet from any other building on any other adjoining lots. This applied to buildings facing Sixth Street only. Such frame buildings must be built subject to the approval of the Council.

This amendment received its first, second and third reading and was passed unanimously.

E. N. Hoyle attended this meeting and supported the Council in their decision of a amendment to By-Law No. 23.

The Secretary was authorized to give the agent of the Crown Lumber Company a written notice that their application had been approved and By-Law No 23 amended accordingly.

The application of Robert Bosch, to drag all streets and alleys, was considered and P. D. Faunt was authorized to interview Mr. Bosch and to arrange for a flat rate for such work and that such work was to be done only on advice of the Council and that each operation must be reported forthwith to the Secretary.

The broken planks in the sidewalks are to be repaired and it was decided to have Mr. Reipschneider take care of same.

The Peddlars license fee <sup>to be</sup> reduced to \$5<sup>00</sup> a year instead of \$10<sup>00</sup> and the By-Law amended accordingly.

This amendment received its first second and third readings and was finally unanimously passed.

The amount of money required for the Village for the year 1933 was discussed and it was moved that the mill rate be set at 7 mills for general taxes, this mill rate to include 2 mills for road purposes, and 3 mills for Supp. Revenue tax.

It was moved that a discount of 5% be given on all taxes paid on or before June 15, 1933.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.  
Done and passed in Council assembled this 27<sup>th</sup> day of April, A.D. 1933.
