The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The matter of John Uselman relief in Calgary was thoroughly discussed. Previous to this meeting an informal meeting was held in the Mayor's office, attending by several ratepayers discussing the advisability of paying relief for the John Uselman family now living in the City of Calgary. The Council was under the impression that Uselman would not be a charge on the Village of Beiseker, according to the statutes pertaining to "Residents", but this was not the case, owing to ~~the~~ a ruling of some kind, and it was the opinion of the ratepayers at the informal meeting and also of the Council at this meeting that Uselman and family could be supported cheaper in Beiseker, owing to the fact that he had his house here, and arranged with Thomas Hagel to take his truck and move the Uselmans back to Beiseker.

The Mayor was authorized to arrange for such removal with the Department of Relief in Calgary which was done as per copies of letters on file.

The Secretary was authorized to pay the Calgary expenses incurred to date.
