The question of repairing culverts and putting in new ones came before the Council and it was decided that we buy from the Crown Lumber Co necessary material, providing the price was in keeping with that of other Companies.

Much discussion about arrears of taxes took place and it was decided that we appoint a Commissioner to look after streets, parks, alleys, vacant lots, sidewalks and any Village property in general and that such Commissioner is to hire men for this work whose taxes are in arrears and allow them to work until such taxes tax arrears are paid up. The price allowed for such work to be set by the Commissioner (according to the nature of the work). All time sheets to be certified by the Commissioner and turned in at the office of the Sec. Treas. where a Tax Receipt will be issued accordingly. The Commissioner to be allowed a reasonable rate of wages for the hours worked.

It was moved by B. F. Weisgerber and seconded by Peter Schmally that Alex Schmidt be and is hereby appointed Public Works Commissioner for the Village of Beiseker to carry out this scheme. Carried.

It was further thought advisable in this connection that whereas there are school arrears of taxes we should meet the School Board in an effort to devise some work scheme whereby the school arrears could be reduced.

The Secretary was authorized to hand Mr Heselman sign a renewal application for relief.

On advice from Calgary Relief Board re Richard Russel and his wife having applied for relief in the city of Calgary and after thoroughly discussing the same, and owing to the fact that we have no place for them to live in Beiseker, it was decided that Mr Schmally and Mr Laurent go to Calgary and interview the said Mr. Russel and if possible come to some satisfactory arrangements.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
