Mr. Lohde advised the Council that all goods under seizure for Bannerman taxes had been sold on Dec. 14, 1936 and proceeds turned over to Sheriff's office, Calgary.

Mr. Sam Krueger interviewed the Council at this meeting and expressed his desire to build an hotel in the Village and requested permission to erect a stucco building. This being contrary to the present By-law, the Council gave this much consideration, and owing to the fact that since the fire of 1922 and again in 1936 it left so many vacant lots on our streets and it was brought to the attention of the Council that other Villages were permitting stucco buildings. The Council then interviewed several of the ratepayers, all of whom thought that our present By-law should be changed, therefore it was resolved that By-law No. 23 and No. 23A. be and are hereby cancelled. The same being replaced by By-law No. 37, which

enacts as follows:-

That no building shall be built, remodelled or placed within the limits of the Village of Beisler without first obtaining a permit from the Council of the said Village.

That the Council of said Village will not issue a permit for a building if in their opinion such building would be a fire hazard and cause the rate of insurance in the zone where same is situated, to be unduly raised.

That all buildings on either side of Sixth Street shall be constructed of brick, brick veneer, cement, tile or stucco, in all cases with a tar gravel roof.

The above By-law received its first, second and third reading and was finally unanimously passed.

The Council at this meeting gave their unanimous approval to Mr. H. H. Heger as hotel licensee for this Village and authorized the Mayor and Secretary to give such information to the Liquor Control Board, if necessary.
