The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

Referring to the request of the new oil station for financial assistance in connection with requests to make an outlet for such station, the Council decided that nothing be done until a plan of the building was obtained so that we would know their location in connection with the streets in question

A letter received from William & William to the effect that Bannerman's lawyers had offered to settle the balance of taxes still owing on the King George Hotel property if we would accept a 50% reduction. The Council refused this offer and Harold Milligan was notified accordingly.

The business assessment on the Schneider Blacksmith Shop was set @ \$1.75 per sq. ft. owing to the fact that no other business was carried on on the said property.

Councillor Weisgerber as a delegation of one was instructed to see E. N. Hazel regarding arrears of taxes and give him the following proposition:-  
That the Council would buy all

necessary relief supplies from J. N. Kerr, a tenant, of E. N. Hoagel, if E. N. Hoagel would allow J. N. Kerr to charge such amount to rent and the Village to pay Hoagel with 2nd Receipt for such amount, such amount not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) in any month.

Adam Veiker was called in for the meeting. The tax arrears in the name of his father, N. Veiker were discussed with him and he agreed that he would use his best influence to have monthly payments made on such arrears.

The Council reviewed assessment roll and approved of same. The Secretary was authorized to mail notices at once.
