Financial Statement for the period of June 1st to July 31st. was submitted to the Council and filed herewith.

The mill rate was discussed and it was quite evident that a raise was necessary, owing to the fact that our relief expenditures have been increased. After much discussion the mill rate was set at 10 mills for Municipal purposes. The mill rate for Social Services Tax set at 3 mills and the following By-Laws received their first, second and third readings:-

By-Law No 39 of the Village of Beiseker
Whereas the ~~Mun~~ Village of Beiseker
accordance with the provisions of the Social Services Tax Act, being Chapter 12, Statutes of Alberta, 1926 as amended, is required to levy the sum of \$114.00 being an amount equal to that which would be produced by a levy of three (3) mills on the dollar upon the equalized assessment of all the rateable land in the Municipality;

and whereas the Municipality has assessed all the property therein which is liable to assessment and taxation for the purpose






of raising the General Revenue of the Municipality under its Municipal Act at a value of \$149,976.⁰⁰
 Now therefore the Council of the Village of Beiseker hereby enacts that a levy of $\frac{3}{4}$ mill on the dollar be made against all the property in the Municipality which is liable to assessment and taxation for General Revenue purposes for the year 1937, in order to raise the sum of \$114.⁰⁰ as required by this Act.

By-Law No. 40.
 The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That the mill rate for Municipal purposes be ten (10) for the year 1937.

After the necessary readings the above By-Laws were unanimously passed.

It was moved and recorded that a discount of 5% be allowed on Municipal taxes if paid on or before September 1st, 1937. carried.

The Secretary was asked to write the General Hospital, Calgary, that the Scheffelmaier account of ^{\$64.85} would be paid at once, if the usual 15% discount were granted.

Mr Peter Schneider was asked to attend the meeting at this time to discuss tax arrears on his property. Mr. Schneider stated that he was going to rent his blacksmith shop and residence for a rental of approximately \$20.⁰⁰ per month. He advised the Council that he was moving to Calgary and if he would be allowed to collect

the ~~up~~ rent for one year in order to get established in Dargery, he would after that time apply the rent on arrears of taxes monthly until all arrears of taxes are paid. The School Board was also called in to discuss the arrangement and it was found satisfactory to them.

The Secretary was asked to write the Commissioner, Bureau of Relief and Public Welfare and ask for information as to the amount of reimbursement paid by their Department on transient relief issued by the Village.
