The matter of Henry Bogardt's relief came before the Council and after considerable discussion it was moved by L. F. Weisgerber seconded by P. Schmaltz that whereas Henry Bogardt had been earning good wages since March to date, and whereas he is still earning \$10.00 per month as janitor at the bank, that this Council recommend \$15.00 per month less any money he may earn in the meantime. carried.

The Secretary was asked to advise all merchants to charge no relief accounts to the Village of Beiseker unless and until said account had been duly signed by an authorized agent of this Council.

Due to the lateness of information from the Provincial Government as to the proper taxation of the Calgary Power Company, the Council hereby authorizes the disbursements to be allowed on the additional tax the Power Company was ordered to pay.

The Secretary was authorized to make the changes necessary in assessment totals & By-law, governing mill rate, due to the change in Power Company assessment.

The wages for relief work was discussed and it was decided that such work to be paid at the rate of 25¢ per hour, such amount being considered as comparing favorably with other work being done in the municipality.

The question of bringing Mr & Mrs Rucsov back to live in Beiseker, who are now being given relief in the City of Calgary, was discussed and after much discussion it was decided to give Mr & Mrs Rucsov notice to return to Beiseker on or before October 5, 1937, and to advise them that housing accommodation had been arranged, and transportation to Beiseker would also be arranged.

Mr Peter Schmaltz informed the Council that two rooms could be rented for Mr & Mrs Rucsov for \$10.00 per month from Mrs Julia Schmaltz and the Council decided that to rent the two rooms at \$10.00 per month and Mrs Schmaltz to furnish rooms with paragon bed, table and chairs. Rent to commence on October 6, 1937.

The monthly financial statement was submitted to the Council and filed herewith.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
