

Beiseker, Alberta  
April 16, 1940.

A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in F. A. Lount's office on April 16, 1940. All Councilmen were present; namely, Lount, Weisgerber & Schmaltz. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The Sports Committee, namely Louis Schmaltz & Ray Fulton, were present. They had been previously ~~scheduled~~ <sup>assured</sup> to attend this meeting.

The matter of planting trees around park grounds was discussed by all present.

The Sports Committee advised the Council that the ground was in good condition and that it had been kept well cultivated during the summer of 1939, and that the trees would be here for planting by May 10<sup>th</sup>.

It was decided to arrange for a tree planting day between May 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> when all citizens are to be asked to assist. Wm. Hedrick, of Trochu, who is the representative for the Brooks Nursery from whom some of the trees have been purchased, agreed to be in Beiseker on a day arranged for the planting, to assist and supervise the work.

The Council agreed to move the back stop and benches from the baseball diamond to a new location in the park ground and the Sports Committee agreed to prepare ~~and~~ the ground for the new diamond. The location of the baseball diamond to be selected by the members of the Council and the Sports Committee.

Nick Teber was called in to this meeting and he was asked to move the machinery which he has been placing on part of the park grounds where the

trees are to be planted. Mr. Becker agreed to move the machinery.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
