3rd. The Road allowance lying South and West of said described lands.

To have the above described lands separated from the Village of Beiseker it is necessary that the following By Law be passed: - carried.

By-Law No. 56
A By-Law of the Village of Beiseker Relating to the Separation of certain lands from the Village of Beiseker.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That the following lands be separated from the Village of Beiseker,

all of the South Half of Legal Subdivision 4 of Section 13 Township 28, Range 26, West of the 4th Meridian, in the Province of Alberta, containing 20 acres, more or less. Subject to the right of expropriation of certain portions thereof as contained in Transfer 15100 AB and Reserving unto the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, all mines and minerals and the right to work the same,

That portion of the South Half of Legal Subdivision 3 of Section 13, Township 28 Range 26, West of the 4th Meridian, in the Province of Alberta, lying West of the Railway Right of Way as shown on a plan filed in the Land Titles Office as R. 226. Subject to the right of expropriation of certain portions thereof as reserved in Transfer 15100 AB and Reserving unto the Canadian Pacific Railway Company all mines and minerals and the right to work the same.

The Road allowance lying South and West of said described lands.
