A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in F.A. Laurent's office on Aug. 30th, 1943. All Councillors were present, namely, F.A. Laurent, C.F. Weisgerber & L.S. Schmaltz. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The financial statement for the month of August was submitted to the council. The statement was discussed and approved.

By-laws No. 29 (a) and 58 received third reading and were unanimously passed.

The secretary was instructed to make copies of By-law No. 58 and deliver same to persons who had signed the petition asking that such a By-law be passed.

The secretary advised the council that the notice to Relatives of Persons on the Assessment Roll and to Servants and to Relatives of Servants under sec. 188 of the Town and Village Act, had been prepared and posted.

A representative from the Beiseker Curling Club attended the meeting and presented the following figures as expenses of 1942-43 curling & skating season:-

Fuel	_____	22.20
Caretaking	_____	225.00
Lights	_____	86.19
Total	_____	\$333.39.

These figures were thoroughly discussed by the Councillors & members of the Curling Club present. Owing to the fact that the skating rink was not used as much during this season as in previous years it was decided that the Village pay one quarter of the total expenses (25%) and not the percentage as paid in previous years.

25% of \$333.39 = \$83.35

Village has already advanced 86.19 by paying lights. Therefore Curling Club to issue ck for \$2.84, being difference between 86.19 - 83.35 = \$2.84.

The estimate for 1943 was presented to the council for consideration. All items were checked, discussed and adopted. The sheet was placed on a special file.

By-Law No. 58 authorizing current municipal tax levy was drawn up

By-Law No. 58 authorizing current municipal tax levy -

Whereas, the estimated expenditure for the Village of Beiseker for the year 1943 is \$1782.69 as per estimate in detail duly recorded; and

Whereas, the total assessed valuation of taxable property within the said Village, as shown by the assessment roll, is as follows:

Land	16,975.00
Buildings and Improvements	115,540.00
Special (Calgary Paper Co. "Works")	6,000.00
Total assessment	<u>138,515.00</u>

and whereas, it is estimated that the sum of \$185.00 will be collected from sources other than current levy, thus leaving the amount to be collected from current taxes

----- \$ 1597.69
 to which is to be added for non-collection 185.00
 making the total current taxes to be levied \$1782.69

Therefore, the Secretary-Treasurer of the said Village is hereby authorized to raise the said amount, namely \$1782.69, by a levy upon all land, buildings and improvements assessed ^{therein} at a rate of 13 mills on the dollar of assessed value, for municipal purposes.

And a levy of 10 mills upon special assessed property therein.

The above By-Law received first, second and third reading and was unanimously passed.

It was moved that the meeting adjourn.
