

Beiseker, Alta
Feb. 18, 1946

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held at Mr. Adams' office on Feb. 18, 1946 with all councillors present.

The meeting was called to order and the returning officer gave the result of the election;

That Charles F. Weiskoper was elected by acclamation for a term of three years ending February 1949.

Charles F. Weiskoper signed the declaration of office for councillor.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

It was moved that F. A. Launt be mayor for the year 1946. carried

The following appointments were made:-

L. M. Katterbach was appointed auditor for the year 1946 at a fee of \$25.00.

Rod Wagner was appointed Secretary Treasurer for 1946 at a salary of \$200.00

L. R. Schmaltz (Councillor) was appointed to take charge of all public works for the year 1946.

Public work discussed and considered for 1946 as follows:-

4 ft. sidewalk from east side of alley on 6th Street to 1st Ave, and from 6th Street to 5th Street

Culverts on 3rd Ave. and 7th St. to join with highway.

Culvert on corner of 2nd Ave & 5th St.

Streets and Avenues to be opened:-

3rd. Avenue between 6th & 7th Street

7th Street to be opened to join with highway.

Graveling:-
Second Avenue from 6th Street
to connect with Municipal Road (North of
School)

It was moved that P. F. Lawrence, of
Carbow. Alta, assess the land and improvements
within the boundaries of the Village for the
year 1946.

It was moved that Matt Schmidt
be appointed building commissioner for
the Village of Beiseker.

Moved that the Village give lease of
site to Beiseker & District Memorial Hall
Company.

The application of Parker & Bettis to open
and operate an egg grading station
was read.

It was decided that Matt Schmidt,
Building Commissioner, be asked to
investigate the building and report to Council.

The financial statement for the month
ending Jan. 31st was submitted to Council
and signed by the Mayor.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
