Councillor Schmaltz, who is also President of the Beiseker Lions Club, informed the Council that the club will sponsor a clean up day in May. The Council assured that the Village would be glad to cooperate in every way to make the day a success.

Mr. Raent advised that he had been in touch with Mr. D. K. Pearce, Surveyor and that a surveyor would soon be

available to do surveying in the Village of Beiseker.

It was decided that, if owners of full blocks or parcels had some surveyed into lots the assessment would not be raised until lots are sold for building sites or improvements put on same by owners.

Some discussion took place as to the closing hour of business places and it was decided that By-Law No. 57 be repealed and a new By-Law drawn.

By-Law No. 57(A)

A By-Law to repeal By-Law No. 57.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That By-Law No. 57 be and is hereby repealed.

The above By-Law received three readings and was unanimously passed.

By-Law No. 66

A By-Law of the Village of Beiseker to regulate the closing of places of business.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That all places of business, except garages, service stations, pool rooms, restaurants, hotels, grain elevators and places of business under government control, shall open at 8 o'clock a.m. and close at 6 o'clock p.m. daily, except Saturday when the closing hour shall be 11 o'clock p.m. and Wednesday when the closing hour shall be 1 p.m.

The above By-Law received its first, second and third reading and was unanimously passed.

By-Law No. 67

A By-Law of the Village of Beiseker relating to the assessment of land and improvements.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker hereby enacts:-

That the assessed value of land together with all buildings and improvements thereon, within the Village of Beiseker, which are not exempt from assessment and taxation, shall be the value of the land together with the buildings and improvements thereon not so exempt reduced by an amount equal to one-third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of the value of such buildings and improvements.

The above By-law received three readings<sup>1-</sup> and was unanimously passed.
