

Beiseker, Alta
March 30, 1946.

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held at the office of F.A. Lounsbury on March 30, 1946. All councillors were present, namely,

F. A. Lounsbury, Mayor
C. F. Weisgerber, Councillor
R. L. Schmaltz, Councillor.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The estimates for the year 1946 were submitted to Council for consideration. All items were discussed and adopted and the following By-Law drawn

By-Law No. 68
A By-Law of the Village of Beiseker authorizing current tax levy for the year 1946.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

Whereas the estimated expenditure of the Village of Beiseker for the year 1946 is \$6787.69 as per estimate in detail recorded and

whereas the total assessed valuation of taxable property within the said Village as shown by the assessment roll is \$153,974.00

and, whereas, it is estimated that the sum of \$272.00 will be collected from sources other than current levy, thus leaving the amount to be collected from current taxes \$7265.69

to which is to be added for non-collection 348.18

making the total current taxes to be levied 7613.87

therefore the mill rate shall be for

Parial Services Tax $\frac{1}{2}$ mill

School Tax 32 mills

Municipal Tax 17 mills

making the combined rate $49\frac{1}{2}$ mills.

The above By-Law received three readings and was unanimously passed.

The estimates for 1946 set out in detail on prescribed form had been placed on special file kept for that purpose.

Tax arrears were discussed and it was decided that a By-law be passed imposing a penalty of 5% on all unpaid taxes; the By-law to read as follows:-

By-law No. 69

A By-law of the Village of Beiseker imposing a penalty on unpaid taxes.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That, if after the 31st day of March in any one year, any taxes which become due and payable in any preceding year remain unpaid, there shall be added thereto by way of penalty an amount of 5% on the first day of April of that year and each succeeding year so long as the taxes remain unpaid, and every amount so added shall form a part of the taxes which are created a special lien upon the land under the provisions of the Town and Village Act.

The above By-law received three readings and was unanimously passed.

The Secretary-Treasurer was instructed to send certified copy of By-law No. 69 to the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

Discount on current taxes was discussed and it was decided that a discount of 5% be allowed and the following By-law drawn:-

By-law No. 70

A By-law of the Village of Beiseker providing for discount for prepayment of taxes.

The Council of the Village of Beiseker enacts as follows:-

That a discount of five per cent (5%) shall be allowed on all current taxes paid on or before May 10th.

By-law No. 70 received three readings and was unanimously passed.
