Dec. 30, 1946.

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in F. A. Laurent's office on Dec. 30th 1946.

All councillors were present, namely, F. A. Laurent, Mayor, C. F. Weisgerber and L. L. Schmaltz, Councillors.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted.

It was reported that stray dogs are becoming a nuisance in the Village and it was decided that a notice be put in the Beiseker Time asking all owners of dogs to purchase a license at once as all stray dogs will be destroyed.

It was also decided that a new sign directing residents of the Village be put in the Beiseker Time.

F. A. Laurent and L. L. Schmaltz reported that they had made an inspection of the skating rink and that the ice was not in good condition. It was decided that F. Weisgerber, President of the Curling Club and Adam Velker, ex-man, be called into the meeting. After discussing the matter with them it was thought that it would be more F.A.L.



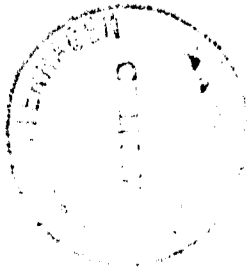
