

Beiseker Alta.

Oct. 15, 1947

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in P. A. Laurent's office on Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>, 1947 with all members of the Council present, namely,

F. A. Laurent

L. K. Schmidt

C. F. Weisgerber.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and adapted.

The Council have experienced difficulty in the drainage of flood waters particularly in the spring of the year. Ordinary precipitation has been taken care of only by natural elements which usually were insufficient, resulting in the deterioration of streets, sidewalks, basements etc and causing an over expenditure to maintain a passable surface of streets.

Now that the traffic is heavier some of the streets are impassable many times throughout the year and the Council resolved that the only way we could possibly get a certain amount of satisfaction was to employ the services of a surveyor to determine the course of drainage and the depth. This was authorized and the surveyor's work was completed and the plans are on file, and now Matt Schmidt was engaged to get permission from the Men. District of Ketchikan to use their road building equipment to follow out the surveyor's plans as to the drainage and building up of certain streets.

The following is an outline of the work to be done:-

Open drainage along the highway at the North end of the Village between 1st and 2nd Ave. following around the corner of 1st Ave and 4<sup>th</sup> Street. 4<sup>th</sup> Street to be built up.

Alley in Block 1 to be opened and ditches cleaned out.

A ditch to be made on 8<sup>th</sup> Street between 2nd Ave and 4<sup>th</sup> Ave. and the corner of 3rd Ave and 8<sup>th</sup> Street built up.

From 4<sup>th</sup> Street the water course to be followed through to the C.N.R. railroad bridge and from there to the bridge on the highway.

2nd Ave to be rebuilt from 6<sup>th</sup> Street to the highway on the Northern boundary of the Village.

The work outlined above will necessitate 123 feet of culverts

It was brought to the attention of the Council that the sidewalk opposite the locker storage should be cleared of debris. Mr Weisgerber volunteered to ask Mr Savoie to have same removed.

Ed Wagner informed the Council that she would discontinue her services as Secretary at the end of the year 1947 and stated that the books would be ready for audit immediately after the close of the year.

Suggestions were made as to who might be engaged as secretary. L. B. Schmally was asked to interview Mr A. P. Donnelly. It was the opinion of the Council that if Mr Donnelly could be engaged he would be very competent.

The Secretary was authorized to advise the Calgary Power Company that the curling rink has been under the management ~~control~~ of the curling club since March 15, 1947, and that the Village is no longer responsible for the payment of light used in the curling rink.

Moved that the meeting adjourn.
