April 24, 1950

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseby was held in Louis Garage on Monday, April 24th commencing at 8:30 PM with all councillors in attendance namely L. H. Schmalz, Leo J. Schmalz, & Adam Velber.

Moved by Leo Schmalz that the minutes from the meetings held March 6th & March 11th be adopted as read. Carried.

Moved by Adam Velber that the financial statement for the month of March be adopted as correct. The Secy-Treasurer & Mayor signed the statements. Carried.

The Secy-Treasurer advised the Council that we had received our school requisition from the Wheatland School Division & amended to \$7578.14. This was \$826.68 greater than last year, & also, our first quarterly requisition had been paid.

Acting upon the wishes of the rate payers, ^{at the last annual meeting,} the Secy-Treasurer wrote several letters regarding the costs of having our financial statements photo-lithed. For the information of the Council, letters from the Wheatland School Div, the Municipal District at Three Hills, & from Municipal Supplies Ltd. were read. It was noted that 200 statements would cost approximately \$56.50. The Council decided to have this in mind when preparing the estimate.

A letter from J H Schmalz, Executor of the Andrew Schmalz Estate was read to the Council. The Executor requested the Village that he would investigate the possibilities of selling their property amounting to 23 acres more or less to the Village.

The letter from the Canadian Welfare Council requesting a donation was tabled. Several other letters from different institutions also requesting financial aid were also filed away.

A letter from the Calgary Power acknowledged our letter of appreciation regarding the stationing of A. Droidle, District Manager in Beiseby was read to the Council.

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind requested permission from the Council to hold a Day Day in Beiseby sometime during

the latter part of September. Permission was granted, & the Deey was to advise the National Institute for the Blind accordingly.

A letter from Mrs. E. Walker addressed to the Mayor was read to the Council. In this letter Mrs. Walker requested the Village to pay her debts which she had incurred within the Village. After a lengthy discussion dealing with the contents of her letter, the Council came to the conclusion that the revenue of the Village could not be used for this request merely due to the fact that her husband was evading his responsibilities to Mrs. Walker and dependent. The Council, however, made a suggestion that Mrs. Walker get in touch with her lawyer, in order that he might investigate the reason or reasons why Mr. Wm. Walker had stopped paying alimony to her. The Deey was requested to write this letter forthwith.

The local Board of Trade wrote a letter to the Secretary stating that there were unlicensed dogs within our Village. The Board of Trade asked that this be brought to the attention of the Council at their next meeting. Investigating this as closely as possible, it was discovered that Alex Uffelmann owned one unlicensed dog and Jack Decarie, the new Crown lumber manager owned two unlicensed dogs. As Mr. Decarie had only recently moved to Belvidere, the Council requested the Deey to see Mr. Decarie personally in this regard. However, in the case of Alex Uffelmann, as two previous requests had been mailed to him, the Council decided that sterner action should be considered. It was decided to write him a registered letter, allowing him ten full days for him to apply for a license before pressing charges against him as provided under City Law #6.

The Deey-Treasurer reported to the Council that the assessment slips had been mailed April 14th, and that to date one appeal had been received. This required a date to be set for the Board of Revision, & as the assessor wished to be present at this sitting it was decided to write to the Director of Assessments and asked his advice. May 22nd or May 29th was suggested as the possible date for the Board of Revision. The Deey was also requested to write to the Municipal Supplies for the prescribed forms in connection with the Board of Revision.

The Mayor reported that he had seen Leo Scheffelmair in connection with the statement received from the Holy Cross Hospital. The Mayor stated that he urged Leo to make arrangements to pay this bill as quickly as possible.

The Deey reported that to date he had not received any money from Peter Schmalz, Mike Baumair, nor the Municipal District of Wheelhill with regard to the survey made to Block "A" last summer. The Council requested the Deey to see Mr. Schmalz in this regard.

It was brought to the attention of the Council that the Skating Rink House had been rented to Mr. Campbell, a road surveyor in connection with #9 Highway. The Council decided to rent this building to Mr. Campbell for \$10.00 a month, & that Mr. Campbell pay the light and fuel bill. The rink was occupied April 15th.

The garbage situation within the Village was discussed. Although our Village in general was quite clean and

tidy, there were many improvements which could be made. It was decided to educate the householders in some measure if we could. The Secy was therefore requested to write to the Department of Public Health, Division of Sanitary Engineering, Edmonton, for information in this regard. As rats were also threatening to invade Alberta, and garbage was a factor in their feeding & breeding areas, it was also decided to write to the Division of Entomology, Department of Public Health for information regarding garbage in relation with rats, which could be distributed to the householders.

Moved by Louis Schmalz that a street light be installed at the corner of Third Ave and Seventh Street. Carried.

Moved by Leo Schmalz that a street light be installed at the corner of Third Ave and Eighth Street. Carried.

The Secy was advised to instruct Mr. A. Droyelle of this decision forthwith. The Secy was also asked to mail a copy of this letter to the Calgary Sewer-Dept., Calgary.

The Secy suggested that the Council should inquire whether the Village was eligible for road grants from the Government. It was decided to write to the Department in this regard as many new streets had to be opened within the Village shortly.

A preliminary survey of the Village ^{estimates} for the year 1950 was made. As the known total of the assessment was not definite, no mill rate could be set.

Moved by Adam Velles that the meeting do now adjourn June 12:30 A.M. Carried.
