October 10, 1950

A meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseke was held in the Mayor's office, Louis Gargel on Tuesday, October 10th commencing at 8:15 P.M. Councillors in attendance were L. G. Schmalz, Leo Schmalz and Adam Velke. In attendance also was William Jones, Gove, representing a portion of the business men of the Village.

Moved by Leo Schmalz that the minutes from the last meeting be adopted as read. Carried.

Moved by Adam Velke that the financial statements for the months of August & September be adopted. Carried. These were signed by the Mayor & Secy & Treasurer.

A garbage bill from Steve Silbernagel, an excruciating statement from G. Schmalz, & a gravel bill from H. Keller Construction were authorized for payment by the Council.

The Secy Treasurer read a letter from a group of business men of the Village requesting an amendment to By Law No 66 which regulated the closing & opening of places of business within the Village. The main request was to have the Wednesday closing hour changed from 1:00 P.M. to 12:00 noon. Another request was to open during the winter months from November 1st to March 31st at 9:00 A.M. and close at 5:00 P.M. daily except for Wednesday & Saturday. W.M. Jones acted as spokesman for the merchants. The Council decided to gather information from neighboring villages & towns, & from the Department of Municipal Affairs, as to their early closing By-laws & Ord, before considering any amendment to our By Law No 66.

The Municipal Inspector's Report on the Village of Beiseke was read to the Council. The report was discussed by the Council, and then filed for future reference. The Mayor was to acknowledge receipt of the report to the Deputy Minister, Department of Municipal Affairs, Edmonton.

A letter from the Holy Cross Hospital re Leo Scheffelmair's account was read to the Council. The Council instructed the Secy to answer the letter advising the Hospital to refer to our letter of July 5th. The Secy was also asked to mention the fact that Mr. Scheffelmair is now employed with Coco Devine, Calgary.

A circular from the Department of Agriculture, Field Crops Branch informed the Council that the Norway Rat has been declared a pest as provided in the Agricultural Pests Act of our Province. This means that any or all rats are to be destroyed at once, if any are detected. The Department suggested that the Council of each municipality, by motion, or by By-law appoint someone to inspect for the presence of rats. It was moved by Adam Velber that W. J. Lavoie be appointed for this position. Carried. The Deey Treasurer was instructed to advise Mr. Lavoie of his appointment, & advise the Department of Agriculture if the position was accepted by Mr. Lavoie.

The Deey Treasurer read a circular letter from the Department of Public Welfare which requested refunds of any monies collected from indigents who may have benefited from previous Government grants. As there were no indigents & no money had been received from the Govt, the Deey Treasurer was instructed to advise the Department accordingly.

The firm of Jeney, Jeney, McGillivray & Robertson representing a group of Barristers, Solicitors, & Notaries, requested a copy of our Draft By-laws. As we had none, the Deey was instructed to advise them accordingly.

The Restaurant Inspection Reports on the United Cafe & Star Coffee Bar dated September 26th were noted & filed.

Moved by Leo Schmalz that a Building Permit be granted to Alex Goodman to construct a garage on lots 19-21 Block 13 Plan 1192FR. Carried.

Moved by Adam Velber that a Building Permit be granted to L. L. Schmalz to add an addition to his home on lot 3 Block 11 Plan 1192CH. Carried.

Moved by L. L. Schmalz that a Building Permit be granted to the Wheatland School to move a school Building onto the proposed school grounds. Carried.

A Building Permit Application from the Wheatland School Commission requesting the moving & construction of two teacherages was presented to the Council. The proposed site for these teacherages was in the school grounds, but facing Fifth Street. There was no definite surveyed site or lot for these houses, & also no legal area or alley providing for an outlet for the garbage collected, coal trucks etc. Further, the Health Act provided certain regulations as to the construction of outside toilets. Under the circumstances the Council felt that it could not pass permits for these constructions at the present time. The Deey Treasurer was advised to instruct the School Commission accordingly.

The Deey Treasurer advised the Council that the Department of Public Works Surveyor, Mr. Campbell, no longer rented the Skating Rink House. Rent for five

full months, on a total of \$ 50.00 was realized. However, the rink was occupied for approximately 1 1/2 weeks longer than five months, & the Secy. Treasurer felt that Mr. Campbell, & home Bunyan, school teacher, who used the rink proper for foot ball practices arranged amongst themselves as to the payment of rent for these few days. The Secy Treasurer was instructed to see Mr. Bunyan regarding this.

To date, the Secy - Treasurer had not received the \$ 3.00 from E. Kroschel for the sidewalk approach.

Moved by Adam Velles that the meeting do now adjourn.
