Civil Defence: A circular letter dated August 8th addressed to the Mayor of the Village of Bereside was read to the Council. It dealt with civil defence courses to be held in the Provincial School of Agriculture at Olds, Alta, & requested that each municipality have someone to attend this school. The Mayor stated that he would get in touch with the Councils of Tricoma & Acme, & find out what they are doing in this connection.

Canadian National Phys. Tax Department: A letter dated August 8th claiming that the company was assessed for 13.54 acres of station grounds within the Village of Bereside, when actually they only had 11.96 acres. This letter was filed for future reference.

Department of Public Health Health Units: A request from this department that the Village of Bereside be included in the area to be served by this Health Unit.

Moved by Louis R. Schmalz that the Rural Health Unit which will be established in this District, to serve the Village of Bereside. Carried. The Secy was asked to inform W. Baste, M.D. Director of Health Units regarding this.

Director of Town Planning: A letter from this Department in connection with the proposed subdivision in the S.E. 1/4 Sec 13-29-26-4th M. Mr. Gottlieb Berneth who is very much interested in this subdivision was present for this sole reason. After a lengthy discussion it was decided to hold a meeting with the rate payers in this area to see what could be done.

The Holy Cross Hospital: wanted to know the address of Mrs Scheffelmair. The Secy was instructed to advise the Holy Cross Hospital that Mrs. Scheffelmair was at the present time engaged as an electrician in or about the Mills River district.

Wheat Land School Division in a letter dated July 24th assured the Council that the division were making arrangements with a surveyor to come out to Bereside in the near future & survey that portion of Block W in which the teacherages are located.

The British America Assurance Company in a letter dated June 28th suggesting the Village take out legal liability insurance. The letter was filed away, as the Council decided against taking out the insurance at the present time.

A request from the Canadian Red Cross Society for funds was filed away.

A few weeks ago, a semi trailer belonging to Horace Horden, Red Deer, tore down a string of decorative street lights while passing through Bereside. The cost of repairs amounted to \$6.00. The Secy. Treasurer was advised to bill Mr. Horden with this amount.

The Secy. Treasurer was pleased to report to the Council that the Village of Bereside received \$1372.41 as its share from the Municipal Assistance Fund Account.

To date there had been no applicants for the position of Village Constable as advertised for in a notice posted about the Village.

L.H.L.

The Council agreed that we required a small building to house our fire fighting equipment. Moved by Leo Schmalz that the Village purchase material for such a building, & also that the site for this building be landscaped. Carried. Clarence Metzger was contracted to haul the gravel. To have fire fighting equipment also necessitated the requirement of a siren, the bill which was approved at the beginning of this meeting.

A letter of resignation by the Secretary-Treasurer Peter Bernes was read to the Council. As the Secretary-Treasurer was moving away from Bernes, the resignation was accepted, the date at the present time set for August 31st. The books to be audited as soon thereafter.

Moved by Leo Schmalz that the meeting do now adjourn. Carried.
