

DEPUTY RETURNING OFFICER

The Secretary read a letter from Mr. Jacob Werner, 5039 Palmer Ave., Stockton, California, dated Feb. 18. Mr. Werner requests a birth certificate from the Village. The Council advised the Secretary to forward the letter and an included postal money order, (put in by the applicant), to the Department of Vital Statistics.

Mr. F.J.Lavoie was present at the meeting to ask advise and to register an objection to Mr. Frank Selzler selling milk within the Village limits. His objection was based on the fact that it took away business from his Frozen Food Locker and that there was no guarantee that Mr. Selzler would continue to sell for any great period of time. Mr. Lavoie stated that other farmers had attempted to sell milk in the Village and had not continued very long with the result that the customers ~~would~~ <sup>had</sup> come back to the Locker for milk. This, Mr. Lavoie thought, was unfair seeing that he is in the position of being a steady supply for the trade. The Council suggested that Mr. Lavoie attempt to handle Mr. Selzler's milk for him at the Locker and ~~that if this failed~~ <sup>at the same time</sup> the matter should be referred to the Drumheller Health Unit for investigation. Mr. Lavoie thanked the Council for their time and seemed satisfied with the outcome of the meeting.

Councillor Adam Velker moved that Mayor L.L.Schmaltz be <sup>Mat</sup> Mayor for the coming year. Carried

Councillor Leo moved that Mr. E Burrit Allan of Calgary be appointed auditor for the coming year at last year's fee. Carried

L.W.Bunyan was hired as Secretary-Treasurer for the Village at a salary of \$400.00. The location of the office is to be the Secretary-Treasurer's home.

Mayor Louis moved that the Village Safe be moved to home of the Secretary and that because it will now be a fully equipped office that a phone should be installed therein. The phone shall be on line I3 because the Council members are all on that line and it shall read "Village of Beiseker, Secretary-Treasurer's Office" in the phone book. Carried

The closing of the Skating-Rink was discussed because of the warm weather approaching. Mr. Reifsnyder was to be asked to take down the lights and to close up the rink-house. If the end of the month has not been reached by the time of his release he is to be given the opportunity to round out his time by clearing culverts in town, otherwise he shall be paid on a pro-rata basis. The Secretary was instructed to request the Calgary Power Agent to cut off the Power in the rink-house.

A discussion regarding the dog situation in the Village resulted in Council members resolving to attempt to persuade privately, dog-owners in the Village, to purchase a license for their dogs so that nothing official would have to be done, <sup>at this time</sup> and that there would be no confusion as to what are and what are not stray dogs. A complaint from Mrs. B.German and Mrs. E.N.Hagel had been received by the Mayor with regard to alleged attacks on their persons by the dog owned by Mr. Lou Brosteaux. Councillor Leo advised the Council that he would warn Mr. Brosteaux to keep his dog under control.
