The Council discussed at length the problems that had arisen since the 19th of January with regard to a letter of inquiry that had been written to the Alberta Liquor Control Board. The Council agreed that no action had been asked for with regard to the evening closing hours, 6:30-7:30, of the local Beverage room but rather that they only desired information with which to appease certain ratepayers should the said ratepayers press for action in having the beverage room kept open. It was strongly felt that because of a survey that the R.C.M.P. held, which was very incomplete, that uncalled for disturbance was caused within the Village. The Secretary was directed to write a letter of protest to the said Board to the effect that they had misinterpreted the original letter, that the survey was misguidance and that the Council desires the matter dropped.
