A meeting of the Council of The Village of Beiseker was held at the Secretary-Treasurer's home on Saturday, March 31, commencing at 7:30 P.M. Councillors present were L.L.Schmaltz, Adam Velker and Leo Schmaltz.

Moved by councillor Leo that the minutes from the last meeting be adopted as read. Carried

The Mayor and the Secretary-Treasurer signed the minutes.

The Secretary read a letter from the Beiseker Board of Trade which board desires a meeting with the Council to discuss the fire protection situation in the village. The secretary was advised to write the said board to the effect that there will be a special meeting of the Village Council for this sole purpose in the meeting room of the Beiseker Memorial Hall at 8:30 P.M., April, 7, 1952.

Moved by Adam Velker that the Village of Beiseker accept last years assessment for the year 1952 and post notices according to the Assessment Act. Carried

A clipping from the Albertan newspaper was shown to the Council by the Mayor with regard to the putting in of water and sewage systems by the Village of Carstairs. This Village it was thought is very comparable with ours and as such might be of some

assistance to our Council in event that such a project began here. The Secretary was requested to write to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Village of Carstairs with a view to obtaining information as to the contractor that did the job in Carstairs. It was then suggested by the Mayor that when this information is received that the Council appoint a committee to investigate further the problem of sewage and water disposal in the village.

A discussion of the way in which the payment of the local drayman, S. Silbernagel, is carried out resulted in the agreement of the Council in that the Secretary should write the said drayman and ask him to make a bid for a year's contract for keeping the village clean of garbage and refuse instead of the present method of payment per load.

After a short discussion about the ownership of Block 8 in the village the Mayor promised to go into the Land Titles Office in Calgary before next meeting and attempt to discover under whose name the said block is.

The Secretary was advised that as soon as the estimates for the year are in order that he should write to the Department of Municipal Affairs regarding a Tax Reduction Subsidy for the village for 1952.

The Secretary was also advised to draw up a By-Law to the effect that all ratepayers shall have to pay a minimum hospital tax of \$8.00 for 1952 in order that the tax be on a par with the non-ratepayers fee of \$8.00. It was noted that this has already been passed by the Hospital Board and approved by the Minister of Health with regard to the district as a whole.

The Mayor advised the Council that he had advised Mr. Reifsnnyder of the termination of his job as caretaker for the skating rink and that the caretaker had taken down all the lights, cleaned up the rink, and locked the doors. The Secretary also advised the Council that he had asked the Calgary Power Co. to cut off the Power to the Skating-rink.


The Secretary advised the Council that he had again taken up the matter of the survey of the lots on which the Wheatland School Div. had built teacherages during the last two years with the office of the division and that he hoped for some action on the matter before next meeting.

The Council expressed its desire to obtain new maps of the village because the old ones are out of date. They advised the Sec. to write to The Department of Public Works, Director of Surveys, and inquire as to the procedure in such a matter.

Some two hours were spent by the Council as a whole going over the estimates for the year and discussing each section thoroughly. At the end of that time it was found that as soon as the assessment comes back that the Council could make up its tax role and establish a mill rate.

Moved by Councillor Leo that the meeting do now adjourn.
