A Social Meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Beiseker for the Purpose of Giving Final Consideration to the Location of the Sewage Lagoon.

The Mayor opened the meeting on January 30, 1954, at 9:30 A.M. in the Mayor's office. He explained the reason for the meeting and that the village was being pressed by the water and sewage contractors for an early solution to the problem because they wished to begin work very shortly. The Mayor reviewed the stand taken by the village and opened the meeting for discussion.

The discussion took the form of a review of the pros and cons regarding the three small proposals and the later large one. This discussion resulted in deadlock between the two groups and the result that the matter was dropped. The Mayor then advised the claimants that the Council would probably have no other course than to expropriate.

A discussion of the easement of the pipeline approach resulted in no decision as to the exact route and Mr. Frank Schmaltz promised to report on the Estate's decision in that regard.

The Mayor thanked the two visitors for their time and excused them from the meeting, at 11:15 A.M.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

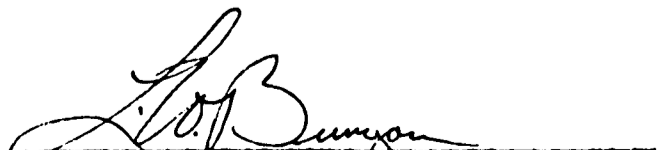
The Secretary-Treasurer advised the Council this BY-Law would be given number III.
