

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker held on Monday the eighth day of November, A.D., 1954, at 8:00p.m. in the Village office.

Minutes: The minutes for the eleventh of October were read by the Secretary-Treasurer upon Motion of Councillor Lavoie were adopted as read. The mayor and the Secretary then signed these minutes.

The above accounts were approved and upon motion of Councillor Lavoie were ordered paid. CARRIED

Prov. Treasurer The secretary read a letter from the Prov. Treas. asking whether the council would be asking for any loans from the Prov. Gov. in 1955. The Council discussed the matter to some length and then directed the secretary to advise the Prov. Treas. that there would be no such request from the Village of Beiseker.

Auditor It was noted by the Council that the Department of Municipal Affairs had passed on Mr. Burrit Allan of Calgary to audit the books of the Village.

Village of Standard. The Secretary of the Village of Standard had written to the secretary-treasurer requesting the opportunity to purchase a quantity of the sewage and water register sheets on hand here. The Council directed the secretary to do what he felt was sensible.

Mrs. Edith Walker The council read letters and documents forwarded from the Town of Three Hills regarding former Beiseker Resident Mrs. Edith Walker. Mrs. Walker has been asking the Town of Three Hills and the city of Calgary for relief under the Mother's Allowance Act. It was felt by the Council, after considerable discussion, that it was no longer the responsibility of the Village of Beiseker to look after this case and it was referred to the Municipal Inspectors who were expected daily.

Father Tennant A letter from Father Tennant of the Beiseker R.C. Parish ( St. Mary's) was read by the Secretary. It was asking questions on the policy of the Village regarding assessment and land taxation and frontage tax regarding church property. After a great deal of discussion the council directed the secretary to look up the information in the assessment act and to get advise from the inspectors.

Gottlieb Berreth It was mentioned by the Mayor that mr. Gottlieb Berreth was desirous of a location on main street and a building permit to move into the village a stucco building. The location desired was beside the memorial hall to the west. The council was informed that he wants 75 feet.


The council agreed that the cost should be \$150.00 per lot and that subsequent charges should be added regarding transfer etc.
