

Nov. 30, 1927.

A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Bunker was held in Mr. Lount's office; all members of the Council present.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

It was moved and seconded that a rink be built in the park on the old grounds and that these grounds be enlarged to 130 feet long by 50 feet wide or there about, also that a 6 foot board fence be put up and a suitable dressing room. The management of this work was to be in charge of Joseph Schmaltz. Jack Riffle was engaged to look after the rink and make the ice at \$50.00 for the first month, to be paid out of the proceed of the sale of tickets.

It was decided that season tickets for school children should be \$1.00 and \$2.00 for all others.

The rink to be open from 2 to 5 every afternoon and 7 to 10 at night.

Single admission for school children 10¢, all others 25¢.

The Secretary was ordered to have 200 season tickets printed reading:

"Bunker Skating Rink"  
so that any left over could be used for another year and was to mark the \$1.00 tickets as follows:-  
"Skating every afternoon from 2-5; 7-10 evenings, except Monday and Thursday. Wednesday until 9 o'clock."

The lights were furnished by the Dominion Garage. The Village paying for the wiring.

Hockey was to be allowed from

3.30 to 4.30 Wednesday and Sunday afternoon  
under the management of M. A. Stout.  
The membership fees for the hockey club  
for the season to be 50¢ each.

All surplus funds to be used by  
said Village to defray expenses and  
cost of said rink.

The Council to reserve the right  
to cancel anyone's ticket who  
should violate rules of said rink.

It was moved and seconded that  
the meeting adjourn.
