A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker was held in H. A. Fuents' office on above date. All members of the board present and notice of same is hereby waived.

The meeting was opened at 7.30 p.m. and the following business transacted

It was moved that the following bills be paid:-

R. J. Lokke, refunded criminal fines 25.00

On April 15th, 1926 an agreement was entered into between W. J. Schulz, Farmer, of Beiseker as to the purchase of a tract of land as a nuisance ground. The purchased price was \$50⁰⁰ per acre. Mr. Schulz was paid \$200⁰⁰ and the balance to be paid when title was issued and number of acres determined by Land Titles Office, as per measurements. Our title covers 5.2 acres and we therefore owe Mr. Schulz \$50⁰⁰ and the Secretary is hereby authorized to issue a cheque for same.

By Law No. 25 of the Village of Beiseker for the Purpose of Assessment and Taxation which reads as follows:-

That all Trades, Businesses, or Professions or any class or classes of Trades, Businesses or Professions carried on within the Village shall be subject to assessment and Taxation and such assessment shall be in accordance with Section 251 of the 1927 Village Act.

This By-Law received its first, second and third reading and was finally unanimously passed and to take effect at once and the Secretary was authorized to put this By-Law in the Village

By-Law Book.
