A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Bunker was held in S. H. Faulstich's office on above date, all members of the Council present and notice of same is hereby waived.

The meeting was opened at 8.15 p.m. and the following business transacted.

The minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

It was moved that the Council hold special meetings to be called by the Secretary-Treasurer on being advised by the Mayor.

By Law, No. 26, known as the Curfew By-Law which reads as follows:-

That children under the age of 15 years, both male and female, shall not be allowed on the streets, nor in Public Places after the hour of 9 o'clock p.m. unless accompanied by father, mother or an older member of the family or by other proper guardianship and no Public Place shall be allowed to harbor children under 15 years of age after 9 o'clock p.m. unless such children are accompanied by father, mother, or an older member of the family or proper guardianship.

Any violation of this Act shall incur the following penalties:-

For the first offence the fine of \$1.00 per child.

Second offence a fine of \$5.00 per child.

Third offence a fine of \$10.00 per child and the same ratio of fines shall be applicable to any land and all ^{public} places violating this Act. Unanimously passed.

Meeting adjourned 11 p.m.
