A special meeting of the Council of the Village of Lutscher was held in J. A. Pann's office, and notice of meeting is hereby waived, all councillors present.

The Secretary Treasurer was asked to make a few notices of the Purpur By-Law No. and post same in conspicuous places around the town so that people might become familiar with same.

Mr Weisgerber volunteered to notify Schepfelmaier about his chickens running at large.

Owing to the fact that Mr. Seigler will not allow the Village to use the old baseball grounds, Mr. Mix has been authorized to remove therefrom all material belonging to the Village and to put same at new diamond in park for convenience of the Baseball Management and if utilized for Baseball purposes will be allowed to remain there. But if not the Village will use same for whatever purpose they may see fit. Mr. Schmaltz was authorized to advise Mr. Thos. Hapt, President of the Lutscher Baseball Club to this effect.

By Law No. 27 re franchise Calgary Power Company and the Village of Lutscher was returned from the Board of Public Utilities and approved by same and received its second and third reading and finally unanimously carried.

The Secretary was asked to write re business assessments, on Railways and Oil houses, to Rockyford, Three Hills, Crossfield and Innisfail.
