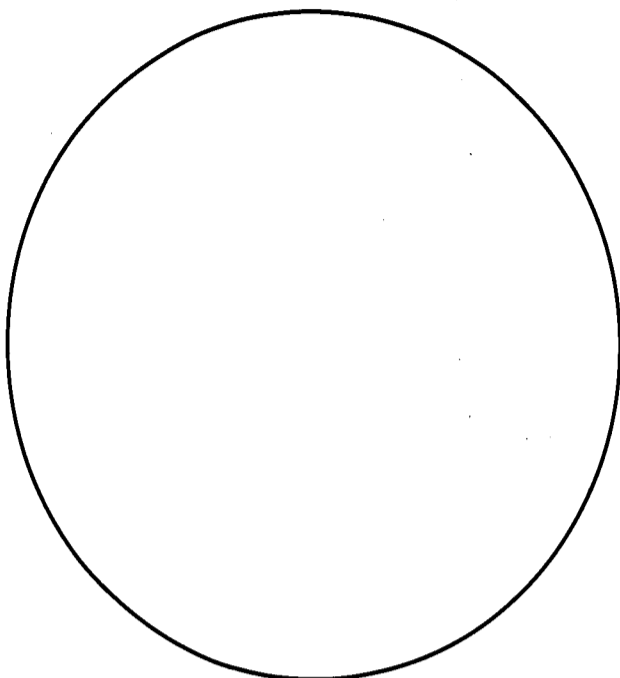

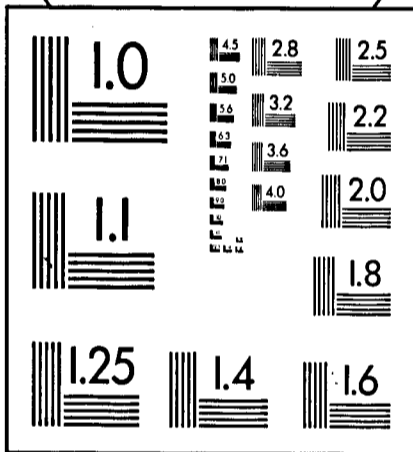



VILLAGE OF BEISEKER MINUTES

DECEMBER, 1954-DECEMBER, 1959

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker, held on Monday the Tenth day of January, A.D., 1955, at 8:00 P. M. in the Village Office.

Councillors present:

Mayor L.L.Schmaltz
Councillor W.J.Lavoie

Minutes

The minutes for the 13th day of December, 1954, were read by the Secretary-Treasurer. Upon motion of Councillor Lavoie they were adopted as read. The Mayor and the Secretary-Treasurer then signed these minutes.

The above accounts were approved and upon motion of Councillor Lavoie were ordered paid. CARRIED

Regarding a letter from the Wheatland School Div. the secretary was advised to write the Insurance Underwriters notifying them of the water and sewage system now in the village.

The building permits for the Beiseker Feed Mill and Carl's Electric were refused until such time as they indicated their intentions regarding the building by-law for Beiseker's main street.

An application for Plumbing and Drainage for Carl's Electric was accepted subject to the above building permit being accepted.

A letter from the Calgary Rural Municipal Hospital District #63 was read informing the council of new Wards and the coming Elections.

A letter from Mr. Mason, Chairman of the Liquor Control Board, was read regarding a request that the village made for information regarding a Liquor Store being established in Beiseker. Mr. Mason stated that the possibility of such a move at the present time was very remote. The council agreed that they now had the information that several ratepayers had requested and that they would press the problem no further.

The C.P.R. and C.N.R. notices of complaint to the Court of Appeals were read by the secretary and noted without comment by the council.

The INSPECTOR'S REPORT was read by the secretary and it was noted by the council that the village auditor had been brought in to examine the books last Nov. and that he had made some changes and declared the books to be in good order.

A long discussion arose out of a letter from the Prov. Golden Jubilee Committee requesting information regarding the council's intentions for celebration of the Jubilee; also that the council was entitled to 25¢ per capita for that purpose. The council agreed after some discussion that they would hand the whole project over to the Lion's Club if they would do something worthy of the Golden Jubilee Celebration.

After lengthy discussion it was moved by Mayor Schmaltz that a caretaker be hired to look after the skating rink for the sum of 100 dollars per month.

CARRIED

Moved by councillor Lavoie that Jack Arenzler be hired for the purpose of being caretaker for the Beiseker skating rink.

CARRIED

Moved that the fees for 1955 for the Beiseker skating rink be the following:

SEASONS: Student....	15 yrs. and down.....	\$1.00
TICKETS: Adult.....	2.00
Family.....	5.00
Individual tickets per period.....	0.25

CARRIED

The secretary was asked to set up a scheduled time table and rules and regulations as usual.

Gooder Bros. Funeral Parlors had asked the council for permission to exhume the body of W.F. Schultz from the village cemetery west of Beiseker. This was done by the funeral parlors upon the request of the family. MOTION by Councillor Lavoie that Gooder Bros. Funeral Parlors be allowed to enter upon and exhume body of said deceased from the Village of Beiseker cemetery and to thereafter leave the cemetery in fit condition.

CARRIED

The Secretary was directed to notify the funeral parlors accordingly.

Upon Motion of Councillor Lavoie the Meeting, having no further business, adjourned. Time 11:40 P.M.
