

THE MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE
VILLAGE OF REISBURY, HELD ON MONDAY THE 12th DAY OF OCTOBER
A.D. 1959, IN THE VILLAGE OFFICE AT 8:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor L.L. Schmaltz
Councillor Velker
Councillor Lavoie
Sec-Treas. D.W. Smith
also R.C.M. Police Const. E.W. Todd and a delegation from the
Memorial Hall board.

Minutes: The minutes of a regular meeting of the Council held on
September 14th were read. Councillor Lavoie moved that the
minutes be adopted as read.
CARRIED
The Mayor and the Sec-Treas. then signed these minutes.

Statement: The Sec-Treas. then read the cash statement for the month
of September.
Councillor Lavoie moved that the statement be accepted
subject to the year end audit.
CARRIED
The Mayor and the Sec-Treas then signed this statement.

Out of minutes: Mayor Schmaltz reporting on the second test well, stated
that a 30 hr. test had shown the well to produce about 16 gal.
per minute. The Mayor also stated that the well was 220 ft.
deep and cased almost to the bottom, and that the well had
produced from 187 ft. down to 205 ft. It was further stated
that this hole is about 2500 ft. from the reservoir.
The Mayor also stated that recent tests showed that there
was too much flourine in both the Village wells now in use
and that the new well would have to be tested before any
decision could be made on its suitability.

Reporting on the matter of gas installations for the
reservoir and skating rink, Councillor Velker stated that the
reservoir had a gas heater installed in it but that nothing
had been done as yet on the skating rink

Mayor Schmaltz reported that the Provincial Gas Inspector
had suggested to him that the Village take on the inspection
of propane installations within the Village, as well as nat-
ural gas installations. The Mayor stated that this would not
include the Trailer Court. After some discussion, Councillor
Lavoie moved that the Council amend the Gas By-Law to include
propane installations

CARRIED

The Sec-Treas. was instructed to write the Dept. advising
of this action and asking for a sample By-Law.

Delegation: Council called on the delegation and Const. Todd spoke
referring to recent near rioting at dance at the Memorial Hall
and stating that he felt that unsponsored dances were the
chief cause of this trouble. Const. Todd felt that the Hall
board should not rent the Hall to an orchestra without a
local sponsor. For the Hall board, Mr Matt. Schmaltz stated
that the Hall board could not turn down an orchestra if they
wished to rent the Hall unless specific complaints had been
made against the orchestra. Mr. J.H. Schmaltz stated that the
boards only authority was inside the Hall and the the Village
was responsible for outside the Hall. Mayor Schmaltz pointed
out that a Town policeman would be a heavy burden on the tax-
payers. After lengthy discussion of the matter at which no
decision was reached the delegation left the meeting.

The Sec-Treas. was instructed to obtain information from
R.C.M.P. headquarters on costs and details of contract
policing for the Village.


Permits: Building Permit application for a car shed from Mr. John Quast was accepted on a motion by Councillor Lavoie
