

Page I. The minutes of a regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker, held on Monday the 12th day of September A.D. 1955, in the Village Office at 8:00 P.M.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker, held on August 8th were read.

Councillor Lavoie moved that the minutes be adopted as read. CARRIED

The Mayor and the Secretary-Treasurer then signed these minutes.

Correspondence:

A letter from Millican & Snodon, acknowledging receipt of a letter from the Village of Beiseker was read.

A letter from the office of Mr. E.C. Collier, stating that he would be back from his holidays about the 15th of September was read.

A letter from the C.P.R. at Medicine Hat, enquiring about the underpass documents was read. The Sec-Treas stated that he had been unable to locate the documents as yet. The Council advised the Sec-Treas to call in the former Sec-Treas Mr. Bunyan who might be able to advise where to find the Docs.

The Secretary-Treasurer put the following building permit applications before the Council for their consideration:-

Councillor Lavoie moved that these building permit applications be approved.

Mayor Schmaltz brought up the subject of the pump house wiring. The Council agreed that some action would have to be taken on the matter. The Sec-Treas was instructed to write Mr. R. Vickerman of Hady, Davis & Brown engineers ~~asking~~ stating that two motors had been burned out in the pump house through apparent failure of the protection devices and asking for advice on having the matter investigated and rectified.

The Sec-Treas put By-Law No. 119 - Providing for Civil Defence and Disaster- before the Council for third reading.

Councillor Velker moved that By-Law 119 be given third reading and passed.

CARRIED

The Council discussed the matter of complaints from local merchants about pedlars of produce brought in from outside the province. The Sec-Treas was instructed to write the Dept. of Municipal Affairs regarding the licensing by the Village of such pedlars.

The subject of presenting Golden Jubilee Anthology's to various residents of the Village was brought up. After some discussion Councillor Velker moved that these books be presented to the members of the Council, and to the appointed officers of the Village, and to the Civil Defence Director of Beiseker.

CARRIED

Councillor Velker brought up the subject of the Village dump ground, stating that it was rapidly becoming a dumping ground for the whole district and that some people were dumping objectional material there. After some discussion Councillor Velker agreed to investigate the cost of new fencing for the grounds.

Councillor Velker stated that he had recieved complaints from some people about alledged unsanitary conditions in the cafe operated by Mr. Jack Chee in the Village. The Sec-Treas was instructed to write the Drumheller Health Unit, requesting an inspection of these premises.

There being no further business to discuss the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Councillor Velker.
