

The minutes of a Regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker, held on Monday, the 14th day of November, A.D. 1955, in the Village office, at 8 P.M.

Minutes;

The minutes of a regular meeting held on September the 12th, and of a special meeting held on November 3rd were read. Councillor Lavoie moved that the minutes be adopted as read.

CARRIED

The Mayor and the Secretary-Treasurer then signed these minutes.

Correspondence;

A letter from the Drumheller Health Unit was read. The letter stated that an inspection had been made of the premises of Mr. Jack Chee, and that it was found to be in a reasonably good state of cleanliness.

A letter from the Canadian National Institute for the Blind asking for assistance in the form of a grant from the Village was read. The Council instructed the Sec-Treas to write the C.N.I.B. stating that the Council felt that the tag day held yearly in the Village discharged the obligations of this Municipality.

A letter from Mr. N.J. Velker of Lethbridge was read. Mr. Velker offered his lot No. 6, block No. 4, for sale to the Village for the taxes owing plus \$60 :00. The Sec-Treas. was instructed to reply stating that the Council could buy land only for certain purposes under the Town & Village Act, and therefore could not purchase the land in question.

A letter from the Dept. of Municipal Affairs in reply to a letter from the Council was read. The letter stated that the Council of the Village of Beiseker could license pedlars of produce brought in from outside the Province.

A letter from Mr. T.W. Snowden to Mayor L.L. Schmaltz requesting that the \$400:00 promised by the Village in regard to the proposed subdivision, be forwarded in trust was read. The Council agreed to send the agreed sum as requested.

A letter from the Unemployment Insurance Comm. advising of the coming campaign for more winter employment was read. No action was taken on this letter.

A letter from the Dept. of Mun. Affairs in answer to a telegram from the Village was read. The letter set out the proper procedure for a complaint to the Municipality from the Village regarding the culvert which was installed at a main drainage point on the north-east of the Village.

Mayor Schmaltz agreed to contact Mr. Collier, regarding this complaint to the Municipality.

The Municipal Inspectors report was read and discussed. The Secretary-Treasurer reported that action had been taken on all points mentioned in the report.

Bills;


The following accounts were presented for payment:

The Sec-Treas brought up the matter of Water & Sewer service rates for churches in the Village. It was pointed out that By-Laws I07 and I08 made no provision for churches in ~~the~~ setting out rates. After some discussion By-Laws I22 and I23 were introduced.

By-Law No, I22

Providing for a water rate of Three Dollars per month for Churches within the Village which use the Municipal water.

Councillor Lavoie moved that it be given first reading.

Councillor Velker moved that it be given second reading.
CARRIED

The Sec-Treas was instructed to present the By-Law at the next meeting for final reading.

By-Law No. I23

Providing for a Sewer Service rate of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents per month for Churches Within the Village which use the Municipal sewer service.

Councillor Velker Moved that it be given first reading.
CARRIED

Councillor Lavoie moved that it be given second reading.
CARRIED

The Sec-Treas. was instructed to send By-Law I23 to the Board of Utility Commissioners in Edmonton for consideration.

There being no further business to discuss at this time the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Councillor Velker
