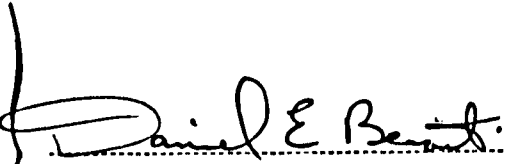

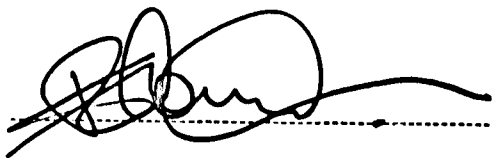

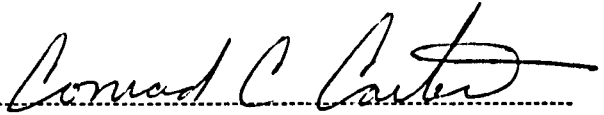

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Richter.

Year to-date Budget versus Actual Statement of revenue and expenditures for the General Operating Fund and Water Operating Fund were presented to Council.

Mayor Richter moved that these financial statements be accepted as presented.

DELEGATION

8:05 P.M. Peter Mulyk - Mercon Engineering Ltd.

(a) North Road Project

Final word has been received from Inter-Provincial Concrete concerning when they will be on site to do the curb and gutter construction for the North Road Project.

Construction was to commence within seven days of the award of the tender. Further contact will be made October 28, 1980 with the contractor to determine the reason for the delay.

(b) Beacon Heights Subdivision Phase II

Peter Mulyk presented to Council, a cost estimate for the servicing of Phase II of the Beacon Heights Subdivision.

(c) Mobile Home Residential Subdivision

Mr. Mulyk presented an engineering servicing report for the proposed mobile home residential subdivision, to Council. General discussion followed on servicing of the southern area of the Village and the need to plan for servicing of this entire portion when designing the trunk lines.

This proposal will be submitted to Alberta Housing Corporation for use in planning of the Mobile Home Subdivision development.

BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

(a) Industrial Park Subdivision

Concern was expressed by Council over the apparent lack of interest in marketing of the Industrial Park by Melton Real Estate through their agent Mr. Harry Ritchie. Mr. Ritchie has been contacted several times within the last few days in an attempt to have him attend a Council meeting to discuss our concerns. As yet Mr. Ritchie has not returned any of these telephone calls. No reply has been received from Mr. Ritchie regarding our written inquiry for copies of advertising and a by-weekly report.

Councillor Courtman moved that a letter be prepared for Mr. Ritchie asking him to prepare a cancellation agreement for the listing of the lots in the Industrial Park.  
Carried.

Deputy Mayor Benoit will deliver this letter and discuss our problems with Mr. Ritchie on November 3, 1980.

(b) Review of Public Works Report

The written report of Mr. Smith was acknowledged by Council. It was indicated that all the sewer lines had been flushed and manholes cleaned. Mayor Richter questioned whether the sewer main in the lane behind the RCMP Barracks and the connection under the CP tracks to the remainder of the Village had also been flushed and cleaned.

Discussion was held concerning Village residents requests to have additional gravel placed in the lanes behind the Beacon Heights Subdivision. It was agreed that this matter would be attended to in the Spring and also during the construction of Phase II of the Subdivision.

(c) Economic Development Committee

Deputy Mayor Benoit reported on his and Mayor Richter's attendance at the Economic Developers Association Conference in Calgary on October 19 to 21, 1980. Several contacts were made with possible developers during their attendance at this conference.

Discussion followed concerning the need to obtain a firm lot price from Mr. Jim Moore of Alberta Housing Corporation for the subdivision property. Discussion was also held concerning the lack of progress in obtaining the Marathon Property.

(d) Mobile Home Subdivision

Discussion was held regarding the recent visit from representatives of Equus Enterprises Limited concerning possible construction of the Mobile Home Subdivision.

Discussion was also held concerning the land price and conditions which have been indicated by Mr. J. VanHee, current owner of the proposed area of development. Mr. VanHee's asking price is \$232,500 for the entire parcel. His conditions of sale include not having to relocate his barn which is currently situated on the road right-of-way and no drainage ditch of any type would be constructed within 100 feet of his property. It is felt that must be room for negotiation of that price.

(e) Canada Community Development Project

Approximately \$2,400 of the proposed operating budget for the project application to carry out prospecting inventory development criterion for small urban centres has not been allowed. It was agreed by Council that should the application to carry out this study be approved, that the Village would be willing to cover any additional expenses incurred with the project.

It was also felt however, that an approach should be made to Regional Resources Project No. 1 for assistance with this funding since the study results would be of regional significance. This possibility will be pursued if in fact approval of the project is granted.

Mrs. Whitnack paid a visit to Mr. T. A. James of Marathon Realty Limited during her attendance at the Economic Developers Conference in Calgary on October 20, 1980. At that time Mr. James could offer no additional assistance as to how the signing of the Option to Purchase agreement could be speeded up. He does hope to have the signed Option Agreement back in the Calgary office by the end of November.

(g) Hospital Board Representative

Councillor Fegan moved that Beiseker Village Council concur with the recommendation made to the M.D. of Rocky View Council, that Mrs. Eilleen Schmaltz be appointed as the Hospital Board Representative for our area.

(h) Water Main Replacement Phase II

Telephone conversation with our lawyer, Mr. A. Bloomenthal has indicated that the lawyers for CanGas Limited and Fidelity Insurance Company of Canada Ltd. have not been replying with the information that he has requested. He will be proceeding to apply for a trial date, and will be reporting to us with further information by the end of the week.

(i) Historical Resources

No further progress has been made concerning the designation of historical sites in the Village.

(j) Beacon Heights Subdivision Phase II

The engineering cost estimate submitted by Mr. Mulyk will be submitted to Alberta Housing Corporation for their approval.

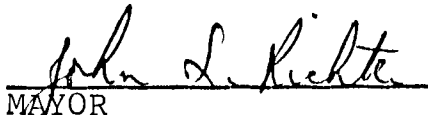
