CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Murray called the meeting to order at 7:35 P.M. and welcomed the Village of Beiseker.

After Crossfield Agenda was adopted and the previous minutes were accepted as presented, Mayor Murray opened discussion with the Village of Beiseker on mutual concerns.

(a) Environment

Contaminated soils within our communities, how we are dealing with this problem, the lack of direction from Alberta Environment, and how can we effectively lobby Alberta Government to understand the far reaching effect this new act is having on the individual Alberta resident.

(b) Mayor Murray will voice our combined motion at the Mayor's Conference in Red Deer and contact A.U.M.A. for casual legal advice concerning contaminated sites and through our Village and town representative on the A.U.M.A., Sandy Beagle.

(c) Our even increasing School requisitions and inadequate Trustee representation.

(d) How are urban centers coping with outside pressure caused by Federal and Provincial Government down loading, school requisitions increasing and local government reducing mill rates to keep the local residents tax levy from increasing.

(e) Mayor Taylor informed Crossfield Council of the water saving devices which we hope to promote in the near future.

- (f) Recycle a big concern to both Councils. Mr. gave a presentation concerning recycling oil filters. Further information shall be forwarded to the Village of Beiseker.
- (g) Town of Crossfield interested on feed back from local residents on the issue of no remuneration paid to our elected officials in the Village of Beiseker. Has the Village realized a saving, how much. Has our mileage set a president by our action?
- (h) - Can there be more sharing of services, equipment, personnel, etc. - thus reducing our administrative, capital and maintenance costs.

- Crossfield is considering leaving the Marigold Library Association siting escalating requisitions as their main reason. Can't we maintain our own libraries more economically?
