PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

(a) 1986 Ford 1 ton Garbage Truck

Allen and Cou. VanHee went to Drumheller to look at a 350 Compaction Garbage Truck and found it to be in fairly good condition. Allen recommended Council purchase it.

Cou. Bell moved to place a bid on the 1986 Ford 1 ton Garbage truck for \$6,000.00 which would include G.S.T. CARRIED

(b) Zacher's Paving - will be done in the 2nd week of August.

(c) Alsa Paving - Will be coming next week to do the paving.

(d) Sewer repair - We will be digging up the sidewalk and pavement in front of Merv McCartney's place to fix a sewer plug on Wednesday.

(e) Campground - A urinal was coming off the wall and has been repaired.

(f) Paul Pedersen - The problem with the meter reading done on Paul Pedersen's place was discussed. Mark Stewart did the reading. A report was filed with the Police regarding the verbal comments made to Allen by Mr. Pedersen.

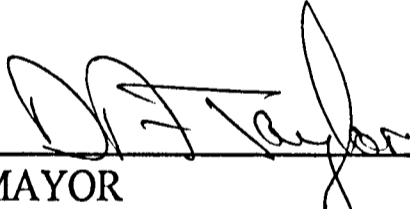

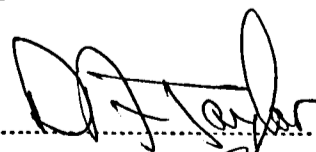

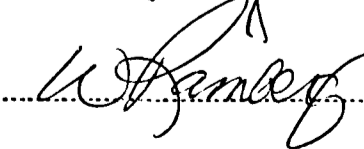
