PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Reservoir #1	The floors, walls and pipes inside Reservoir #1 have all been painted.
Snow Removal	Snow Removal has been done as and when needed.
Backhoe	The fan motor for the heater in the backhoe needed to be replaced.
Bobcat	A new broom was installed on the bobcat.
Water breaks	There were three water breaks over the Christmas holidays two of which were leaking valves. All have been repaired. Will be applying densotape to the valves to prevent further leaking.
Christmas Lights	All of the Christmas lights and decorations have been taken down.
Sidewalks	The sidewalks on main street were salted and cleaned as they were very icy.
Equipment Servicing	All of the vehicles were cleaned and serviced after the three water breaks.

Banff Conference

Truck for Metal

The contractor that previously picked up metal from the transfer site is no longer in business and the metal is now piling up. The Public Works Foreman asked if it would be possible to hire a truck to come in and remove all of the metal. Council asked that the Public Works Foreman contact Calgary Salvage or other metal companies to see if they would be willing to leave a bin in the yard for metal or to contact Courtney Berg in Linden to see how they dispose of their metal.

½ Ton Truck

The rear end in the ½ ton truck has gone again. The truck will also require front end work as well. The Public Works Foreman is obtaining quotes to lease another vehicle. At present, he is using his own truck. The matter will be discussed further at the budget meeting on January 13, 2001.

NEW BUSINESS

COUNCILLORS REPORTS

L'Abbee

Councillor L'Abbee suggested to Council that the Village of Beiseker should consider commencing proceedings to annex the airport land so that the taxes being generated from the airport would then come to the Village of Beiseker instead of the M.D. of Rockyview especially if it is the intention of the Village to take ownership of the airport from the Province.

Res. #2001-01

Councillor L'Abbee moved that the Village of Beiseker commence procedures to annex the airport land from the M.D. of Rockyview. CARRIED UNAN.

Trail Net/ Trans
Canada Trail
Foundation

Councillor L'Abbee suggested that a 10 foot strip of land could be designated for a trail which could be tax exempt, with the remaining land being taxable. Council asked Administration to send a letter to the Trans Canada Trail Foundation indicating that it was Council's intent to conduct an area structure plan for the lands donated by CP Rail and advising that a 10 foot strip would be designated as tax exempt for trail purposes and that the remaining lands would be taxable.

Brochure

Councillor L'Abbee advised Council that he was in Beaumont, Alberta recently and picked up a brochure about the programs offered by the community which also included a brief overview of By-Law information. Councillor L'Abbee suggested that perhaps Beiseker could also produce a similar type of brochure.

North Rockyview
Co-Ordinating Council

Councillor Walters advised Council that he had recently met with the Medical Building Board about the North RockyView Co-Ordinating Council using space in the medical building for ½ day per week. The Board seemed to be receptive to the idea. The next step will be to meet with Dr. Lavens and representatives from the Co-Ordinating Council. Funds from FCSS may need to be allocated to this program.

CRHA

Councillor Walters advised Council that he will be attending a CRHA meeting in Airdrie on January 11, 2001.

Overhanging Trees

Councillor Walters advised Council that he received another complaint regarding the tree branches overhanging the sidewalk by Percy & Olive Thompson's home. It was suggested that perhaps the By-Law Officer could deal with this matter.

AUMA Report

Councillor Walters noted that a report from the recent AUMA Board of Director's meeting was included with the correspondence, but wished to point out the notice regarding natural gas rebates.

- Courtman**
Proposed Civic Centre Deputy Mayor Courtman indicated to Council that he had some concerns regarding the publicity surrounding the proposed civic centre/swimming pool complex and the future operating costs for a facility of this magnitude. Mayor Fegan recommended that all Councillors should be in attendance at the upcoming open forum for this proposed civic centre to express such concerns.
- Recycling Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that he was pleased to have Mr. Elliott in the Public works yard during recycling days. The milk jug recycling program seems to be going very well and he will be attending a meeting later in the month with the Dairy Recycling Group.
- Calgary Airport Area Study Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that the Calgary Airport Area Study had now been released which included a very favourable report on the Beiseker Airport.
- Beiseker Airport Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that the Beiseker Airport Commission met on December 28, 2000 at which time a motion was made to request that the Village of Beiseker Council dissolve the Beiseker Airport Commission and to formally acknowledge it's replacement by an ad hoc Airport Ownership Steering Committee. The newly formed committee would oversee the smooth transition of ownership of the airport from the Province to the Village of Beiseker and the committee would also continue to oversee the operation and maintenance of the airport while transfer negotiations continued. Members of the Airport Ownership Steering Committee would be Lee Robertshaw, Jack Landage, Richard Ruchkall, Sandy Beagle and Les Stait. Deputy Mayor Courtman would continue to represent the Village of Beiseker as an ex officio member.
- Res. #2001-02 Deputy Mayor Courtman moved to have the Village of Beiseker Council dissolve the Beiseker Airport Commission and to formally acknowledge its replacement by the ad hoc "Airport Ownership Steering Committee". CARRIED UNAN.
- Deputy Mayor Courtman indicated that the legal matter surrounding the builder's lien at the Beiseker Airport was now in a wait and see situation. It was also indicated that the existing lease with the Calgary Skydive was extended to 2012 by an amendment to the original lease negotiated in 1992.
- Res. #2001-03 Councillor Walters moved that any new future leases at the airport must first be brought to Council for review and approval before execution. CARRIED UNAN.
- Deputy Mayor Courtman also advised Council that The Beiseker Flying Society had been created and that this would be the society that would be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the airport once ownership had been transferred to the Village of Beiseker. Members of this society are Lee Robertshaw, Richard Ruchkall, Bill Beagle, Les Stait and Jack Landage.
- Priestman**
Recycling Councillor Priestman inquired as to whether the Recycling Society would be prepared to contribute any funds towards the wages for the Transfer Station Attendant for any hours that may be attributable directly to recycling. Deputy Mayor Courtman advised that he did not have that information, however, he indicated that Deanna Bodden from the Recycling Society was coming to the next Council Meeting as a delegation and that question could possibly be addressed at that time.

Cristallo Councillor Priestman inquired as to whether arrangements had been made to have a representative from Cristallo attend a Council meeting. The Administrator advised that Cristallo had been contacted, however, no response had been received. The Administrator was asked to follow up with this item.

Budget 2001

Councillor Priestman suggested that with the budget process coming up, that perhaps a separate account could be established to be used solely for the paving of roads wherein funds could be deposited each year. Council also discussed the issue of local improvements and debenturing for paving projects.

Councillor L'Abbee left the meeting @ 9:02 p.m. and returned @ 9:04 p.m.

Council took a short recess from 9:09 p.m. to 9:17 p.m.

WREDC

Mayor Fegan advised Council that on January 4, 2001 he attended a meeting of the Wild Rose Economic Development Corporation. WREDC is proposing a new program known as "Community Business Beautification" for main street beautification. WREDC is proposing to have \$300,000.00 available for this program which would come from member communities based on population. Main street businesses would be eligible for a loan up to \$3,000.00 to be used only for beautification purposes. WREDC would like to work with Credit Unions, Chambers of Commerce and Councils in administering this program. WREDC would guarantee the principle portion of the loan. More details will be forth coming on this program in the next few months.

Kneehill Water
Committee

Mayor Fegan advised Council that the next meeting of the Kneehill Water Committee will be held on January 11, 2001. The Committee has entered into an agreement with the Town of Drumheller for the provision of water. Applications for funding have been sent to both the Provincial and Federal governments.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Transfer Station
Attendant

On December 14, 2000, the Public Works Foreman and the Administrator met with Mr. John Elliott who agreed to accept the position to man our Transfer Station. It was decided that the Transfer Station hours would be as follows:

Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
2nd & 4th Saturdays (alternate from Recycling Days) from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

After checking with the M.D. of Rockyview and the Village of Irricana regarding dumping fees, a fee of \$10.00/visit was decided upon for non-residents wishing to use the Transfer Station. Transfer Station Passes have been made up and to date approximately 30 residents have picked up their cards.

Tax Auction Sale

The Administrator advised Council that there was a commercial lot on 6th Street which must go to tax auction on or before March 31, 2001.

In order to proceed with the tax auction, the Administrator advised Council that a date needed to be set for the Tax Auction Sale. In order to meet the deadlines for advertising, the Administrator asked that the date be set for March 19, 2001 @ 2 p.m. at the Village Office. Council would also need to set the reserve bid amount and set the conditions of sale. Ed Muchowski of Regional Assessment Management has provided a market value appraisal for the property.

Deputy Mayor Courtman moved that the tax auction sale for 321 - 6th Street, Beiseker, Alberta legally described as Plan 1192 F.R., Block 9, Lot 4 be set for March 19, 2001 @ 2 p.m. in the Village Office and that the terms of sale will be cash or certified cheque.

- Seismic Crew The Administrator advised Council that she and the Public Works Foreman met with Al Droles of Pan Canadian regarding permission to run seismic lines through the Village of Beiseker. Some of the lines would be running in close proximity to Wells #5, #6 & #7. The Permit to Conduct Geophysical Operations included a provision that there was to be a 250 metre exclusion zone from concrete foundations and Wells #5, #6 & #7. 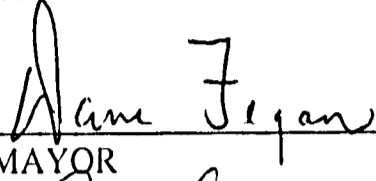

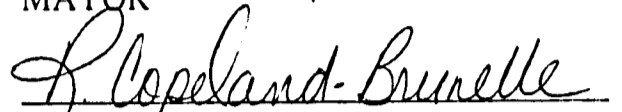

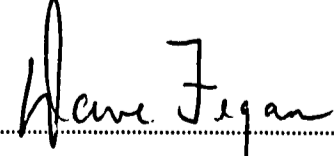
